Data Policy

1. Introduction

1.1 The purpose of this policy is to identify how Taunton Youth Football Club deals with data protection matters internally. It is principally for employees, coaches, volunteers, Trustees and others who come into contact with personal data during the course of their involvement with the Club, to help them understand their responsibility and obligations when it comes to handling personal data. Parents and players who wish to understand what information is held on them and the reasons for this are advised to read the Club's **Privacy Notice**, a copy of which can be found on the Club's website.

1.2 The Club handles personal data about current, former, and on occasion prospective players, their parents or guardians, employees, volunteers, committee members, referees, coaches, managers, contractors, third parties, suppliers, and any other individuals that we communicate with.

1.3 In your official capacity with the Club, you may process personal data on our behalf and we will process personal data about you. We recognise the need to treat all personal data in an appropriate and lawful manner, in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 (GDPR).

1.4 Correct and lawful treatment of this data will maintain confidence in the Club and protect the rights of players and any other individuals associated with the Club. This policy sets out our data protection responsibilities and highlights the obligations of the Club which means the obligations of our employees, trustees, volunteers, members and any other contractor or legal or natural individual or organisation acting for or on behalf of Town Youth Football Club.

1.5 You are obliged to comply with this policy when processing personal data on behalf of the Club, and this policy will help you to understand how to handle personal data.

1.6 The Club's Chair of Trustees (Steve Willis) will be responsible for ensuring compliance with this policy. Any questions about this policy or data protection concerns should be referred to one of the Club's Trustees.

1.7 We process employee, volunteer, member, referee, coach, manager, contractor, committee, supplier and third party personal data for administrative and Club management purposes. Our purpose for holding this personal data is to be able to contact relevant individuals on Club business and our legal basis for processing your personal data in this way is either the contractual relationship we have with you or the fact you or your child (if under eighteen) are a member. We will keep this data for one month after the end of your official relationship with the Club unless required otherwise by law and / or regulatory requirements. If you do not provide your personal data for this purpose, you will not be able to carry out the obligations of your role with the Club.

3. What we need from you

3.1 To assist with our compliance with GDPR we will need you to comply with the terms of this policy. We have set out the key guidance in this section but please do read the full policy carefully.

3.2 Please help us to comply with the data protection principles (set out briefly in section 4 of this policy and in further detail below):

3.2.1 please ensure that you only process data in accordance with our transparent processing as set out in our Privacy notice;

3.2.2 please only process personal data for the purposes for which we have collected it. If you want to do something different with it then please speak with the Welfare Officer first);

3.2.3 please do not ask for further information about players, members, staff and/or volunteers without first checking with the Welfare Officer;

3.2.4 if you are asked to correct an individual's personal data, please make sure that you can identify that individual and, where you have been able to identify them, make the relevant updates on our records and systems;

3.2.5 please comply with our retention periods listed in our Privacy Notice and make sure that if you still have information which falls outside of those dates, that you delete/destroy it securely;

3.2.6 please treat all personal data as confidential. If it is stored in electronic format then please consider whether the documents themselves should be password protected or whether your personal computer is password protected and whether you can limit the number of people who have access to the information. Please also consider the security levels of any cloud storage provider. If it is stored in a hard copy format then please make sure it is locked away safely and is not kept in a car overnight or disposed of in a public place;

3.2.7 if you are looking at a new electronic system for the storage of information please speak with the Welfare Officer first so that we can decide whether a such a system is appropriately secure and complies with GDPR;

3.2.8 If you are planning on sharing personal data with anyone new or with a party outside the FA structure then please speak with the Welfare Officer before doing so who will be able to check that the correct contractual provisions are in place and that we have a lawful basis to share the information;

3.2.9 If you receive a subject access request (or you think someone is making a subject access request for access to information we hold on them) then please tell Steve Willis, Chair of Trustees, as soon as possible because we have strict timelines in which to comply;

3.2.10 If you think there has been a data breach (for example you have lost personal data or a personal device which contains personal data or you have been informed that a coach has done so) then please speak to the Welfare Officer who will be able to help you to respond.

4. Data protection principles

4.1 Anyone processing personal data must comply with the enforceable principles of data protection. Personal data must be:

- 4.1.1 processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner;
- 4.1.2 collected for only specified, explicit and legitimate purposes;
- 4.1.3 adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for the purpose(s) for which it is processed;
- 4.1.4 accurate and, where necessary, kept up to date;
- 4.1.5 kept in a form which permits identification of individuals for no longer than is necessary for the purpose(s) for which it is processed;
- 4.1.6 processed in a manner that ensures its security by appropriate technical and organisational measures to protect unauthorized or unlawful processing and against accidental loss, destruction or damage.

4.2 We are responsible for and must be able to demonstrate compliance with the data protection principles listed above.

5. Fair and lawful processing

5.1 This Policy aims to ensure that our data processing is done fairly and without adversely affecting the rights of the individual.

5.2 Lawful processing means data must be processed on one of the legal bases set out in the GDPR. When special category personal data is being processed additional conditions must be met.

6. Processing for limited purposes

6.1 Taunton Youth Football Club collects and processes personal data. This is data we receive directly from an individual and data we may receive from other sources.

6.2 We will only process personal data for the purposes of the Club as directed by the Trustees, the County FA or The FA, or as specifically permitted by the GDPR. We will let individuals know what those purposes are when we first collect the data or as soon as possible thereafter.

7. Consent

7.1 One of the lawful bases on which we may be processing data is the individual's consent.

7.2 An individual consents to us processing their personal data if they clearly indicate specific and informed agreement, either by a statement or positive action.

7.3 Individuals must be easily able to withdraw their consent at any time and withdrawal must be promptly honoured.

7.4 Where children are involved then the consent must be in writing from parent/guardian

7.5 Where consent is our legal basis for processing, we will need to keep records of when and how this consent was captured.

7.6 Our Privacy Notice sets out the lawful bases on which we process data of our players and members.

8. Notifying individuals

8.1 Where we collect personal data directly from individuals, we will inform them about

8.1.1 the purpose(s) for which we intend to process that personal data;

8.1.2 the legal basis on which we are processing that personal data;

8.1.3 where that legal basis is a legitimate interest, what that legitimate interest is;

8.1.4 where that legal basis is statutory or contractual, any possible consequences of failing to provide that personal data;

8.1.5 the types of third parties, if any, with which we will share that personal data;

8.1.6 their rights as data subjects, and how they can limit our use of their personal data;

8.1.7 the period for which data will be stored and how that period is determined;

8.1.8 any automated decision making processing of that data and whether the data may be used for any further processing, and what that further processing is.

8.2 If we receive personal data about an individual from other sources, we will provide the above information as soon as possible and let them know the source we received their personal data from;

8.3 We will also inform those whose personal data that Taunton Youth Football Club are the data controller in regard to that data, and which individual(s) in the Club are responsible for data protection.

9. Adequate, relevant and non-excessive processing

9.1 We will only collect personal data that is required for the specific purpose notified to the individual.

9.2 You may only process personal data if required to do so in your official capacity within the Club. You cannot process personal data for any other reason unrelated to your duties.

9.3 Taunton Youth FC must ensure that when personal data is no longer needed for specified purposes, it is deleted or anonymized.

10. Accurate data

We will ensure that personal data we hold is accurate and kept up to date. We will check the accuracy of any personal data at the point of collection and at the start of each season. We will take all reasonable steps to destroy or amend inaccurate or out of date data.

11. Timely processing

We will not keep personal data longer than is necessary for the purposes for which it was collected. We will take all reasonable steps to destroy or delete data which is no longer required, as per our Privacy Notice.

12. Processing in line with data subjects' rights

12.1 As data subjects, all individuals have the right to:

12.1.1 be informed of what personal data is being processed;

12.1.2 request access to any data held about them by a data controller;

12.1.3 object to processing of their data for direct marketing purposes;

12.1.4 ask to have inaccurate or incomplete data rectified;

12.1.5 be forgotten (deletion or removal of personal data);

12.1.6 restrict processing;

12.1.7 data portability;

12.1.8 not be subject to a decision which is based on automated processing.

12.2 Taunton Youth FC is aware that not all individuals rights are absolute and any requests regarding the above should be immediately reported to Steve Willis, Chair of Trustees, and if applicable escalated to the County FA for guidance.

13. Data security

13.1 We will take appropriate security measures against unlawful or unauthorized processing of personal data, and against the accidental loss of, or damage to, personal data.

13.2 We have proportionate procedures and technology to maintain the security of all personal data.

13.3 Personal data will only be transferred to another party to process on our behalf (a data processor) where we have a GDPR compliant written contract in place with that data processor.

13.4 We will maintain data security by protecting the confidentiality, integrity and availability of the personal data.

13.5 Our security procedures include:

13.5.1 Secure cabinets and cupboards. Desks, cabinets and cupboards should be locked if they contain personal data;

13.5.2 Methods of disposal. Paper documents should be shredded. Digital storage devices should be physically destroyed;

13.5.3 Equipment. Screens and monitors must not show personal data to passers-by and should be locked when not attended. Files containing personal data (e.g Excel files) will be password protected;

13.5.4 Personal devices. Anyone accessing or processing Taunton Youth FC data on their own device must have and operate a password only access or similar lock function, and should have appropriate anti-virus protection. These devices must have the Club's data removed prior to being replaced by a new device or prior to such individual ceasing to work with or support Taunton Youth FC.

14. Disclosure and sharing of personal information

14.1 We share personal data with the Somerset FA and The FA and with applicable leagues using the Whole Game System.

14.2 We may share personal data with third parties or suppliers for the services they provide, and instruct them to process our personal data on our behalf as data processors. Where we share data with third parties, we will ensure we have a compliant written contract in place incorporating the minimum data processor terms as set out in the GDPR, which may be in the form of a supplier's terms of service.

14.3 We may share personal data we hold if we are under a duty to disclose or share an individual's personal data in order to comply with any legal obligation, or in order to enforce or apply any contract with the individual or other agreements; or to protect our rights, property, or safety of our employees, players, other individuals associated with Taunton Youth FC or others.

15. Transferring personal data to a country outside the EEA (European Economic Area)

We may transfer any personal data we hold to a country outside of the European Economic Area (EEA) provided that one of the appropriate safeguards applies.

16. Reporting a personal data breach

16.1 In the case of a breach of personal data, we may need to notify the applicable regulatory body and the individual.

16.2 If you know or suspect that a personal data breach has occurred, inform Steve Willis (Chair of Trustees) immediately, who may need to escalate to the Somerset FA as appropriate. You should preserve all evidence relating to a potential personal data breach.

17. Dealing with subject access requests

17.1 Individuals may make a formal request for information we hold about them. Anyone who receives such a request should forward it to the Welfare Officer immediately. Nobody should feel bullied or pressured into disclosing personal information.

17.2 When receiving telephone enquiries we will only disclose personal data if we have checked the caller's identity to make sure they are entitled to it.

18. Accountability

18.1 It is the responsibility of Taunton Youth FC to implement appropriate technical and organizational measures to look after personal data and to demonstrate compliance with the data protection principles.

18.2 Taunton Youth FC must have adequate resources and controls in place to ensure and to document GDPR compliance such as:

- Providing fair processing notice to individuals at the time of capturing data
- Raising awareness amongst Trustees, employees, coaches and volunteers on GDPR and the importance of handling personal data responsibly.
- Reviewing the privacy measures implemented by the Club

19. Changes to this policy

19.1 We reserve the right to change this policy at any time.
